



Matthew 16:24-25 (NIV)

Then Jesus said to his disciples, "Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For whoever wants to save their life will lose it, but whoever loses their life for me will find it.

Jesus spoke these words to his disciples moments after harshly rebuking one of his closest friends and followers, Peter. Jesus was trying to teach his disciples a central, non-negotiable part of his plan: his death. For those who might not be familiar with this, Jesus' death is foundational to the Christian faith. The whole purpose of his life led to the cross, and not only did he know this, but it was his plan and choice. Understandably, Peter didn't like this part of the plan so he took Jesus aside and tried to put him in his place by saying things like, "Don't talk like that," or "That's morbid thinking. Think positive, Jesus!"

I have to pause and say that I get where Peter is coming from. If I was a follower of Jesus, the last thing I'd want to hear is him trying to tell me that he HAS to die for his plan to work; I'd want to find another way. But the reality is that there is no other way. So, Peter gets the ultimate smackdown of his life when Jesus shouts at him, "Get behind me, Satan! You do not have in mind the things of God but the things of man." Ouch. This is a hard lesson for Peter but a necessary one that we all need to learn. Am I more concerned with my wants and desires or God's?

From this point, Jesus goes on to teach a simple 3 step plan to be one of his disciples: deny yourself, take up your cross, and follow me.

Pretty straightforward, right? Straightforward? Yes. Easy? I'm not so sure.

Deny Yourself Greek: ἀπαρνέομαι = to act in a wholly selfless manner

This is the first step, and it is imperative that we pause and ask ourselves if we are willing to live this first step out faithfully every day. New Testament scholar R. T. France says concerning this phrase,

"In the light of what follows, it must mean here to dissociate oneself from one's own interests, which in this case means the willingness to risk one's own life. It means putting loyalty to Jesus before self-preservation."

So, before I start living for Jesus, I must first stop living for myself. Let me repeat that one more time. BEFORE I START LIVING FOR JESUS, I MUST FIRST STOP LIVING FOR MYSELF.



How does it feel when you read that? What's going on inside of you as you think about this act of denying yourself? Are you okay with it or are you resistant? If you don't acknowledge this step and submit to its primacy, you will not be able to move forward in your new life with Christ. In fact, I believe this is so important for us as a church in 2024 that through the council of fellow believers and that of the Holy Spirit, this boiled-down, easy- to-understand summary of self-denial is going to be our theme for the year 2024:



That's it. This year is a year that we need to recognize the Gospel, life with Jesus, healing, joy, breakthroughs, reconciliation – all of it – it's bigger than me. That's essentially the message of Jesus to Peter in his rebuke. Peter wanted Jesus to be with him always. He wanted to keep being a part of the amazing ministry of Jesus and go on to see bigger and even better ministry take place throughout Israel and even the Roman Empire. Peter wanted life with Christ to fit his vision of the future. But Jesus'; message to Peter was simple. "This isn't about you. Its bigger than just you."

Church, the Gospel is Bigger Than You. Jesus says in John 14:2 that his father's house has "many rooms." Living with Jesus isn't a 2-bedroom home. Living with Jesus is like the world's biggest resort. The majority of times in Scripture where you see the pronoun "you" its plural. That means whenever you think the bible is addressing just you, it isn't. most of the time the pronoun "you" is plural meaning its addressing a whole community. You and I are just a part of that whole.

Now I didn't even get into the taking up your cross and follow me section. Don't worry. Throughout this year, I will. For now, we can't move on to the other two until we first settle into this first part of the process. I'd like to invite you to finish this moment with me by talking to God and telling him that you are stepping into this truth. Say it out loud right now, "it's bigger than me."



Tithing is the biblical practice of giving 10% of your income to support the operation of the local church organization. We see the first account of tithing in the book of Gensis when Abraham blessed a priest of God by giving him 10% of everything he owned. His example shows us that tithing is a grateful response to God's blessing, not a means of getting more out of Him. And this is the same attitude we should have today as we faithfully give to the local church.

Later in the book of Leviticus we see this practice as a means of providing for the priests, funding the temple, and serving the people through teachings, celebrations, and other rituals of the culture. We employ the


same mindset as we set our annual (see below). Your tithes go to pay the staff, upkeep the properties, and fund church events for all who attend.







Food Pantry | 3600


